NARPO NATIONAL CONFERENCE 2017

Four of your Committee Members attended the National Conference at Skegness in September this year, they were Stan Watkinson, (standing in for Colin Fox), Helen Wickens, Gus Williams and Malcolm Chubbock. The Conference was a real success, as the Conference voted in some changes in the Rules, so, at last, we have some new rules with which to run our Branch. The Rule changes were long overdue and in my opinion we have now a far better structure within which to operate.

One of the outcomes of the rule changes is that only retired police officers are allowed to be "Full Members", and that Full Members only can be elected as a Branch or National Executive Officer. There has also been a re-definition of a retired police officer, to include former police officers who have served in a police force and who met the minimum service, age or ill health requirements that would entitle them to a police pension; and who have not been dismissed or required to resign from a police force by reason of misconduct. This opens up possible membership to exofficers who were prevented from joining Narpo before the rule change.

The only other major change was the standing down of the President Ian Potter, to be replaced by Brian Burdus. We wish a long, healthy and happy "retirement" to Ian Potter.

James "The Captain" KETCHELL was the guest speaker, he inspired all with his stories of rowing across the Atlantic Ocean, climbing Everest and cycling 18,000 miles around the world.

National Conference next year will be at Torquay on 7th September 2018.

SCUBA DIVING SESSIONS—SKEGNESS

Let me introduce myself, I retired from Bedfordshire Police in 2015, as Assistant Chief Constable and have since developed as passion for scuba diving which has resulted in a casual position working at the Skegness Aquarium in their dive team.

Part of my role is instructing and leading Discover Scuba Diving experiences. This experience allows members of the public to learn basic scuba skills dive in the main aquarium tank and get up close and personal with the aquatic life living there, which includes zebra shark, black tipped shark, banded shark, bat rays, Picasso trigger fish, blue tang fish and approximately 70 other species.

Since working at the aquarium I have been able to secure an excellent discounted price for this experience for serving and retired police officers and support staff.

The normal cost to members of the public is, £95 for adults, and £85 under 12's. I have managed to secure a deal with the aquarium for police officers and staff and retired police officers and their close families for £50 per person - almost 50% saving.

These special discounted sessions will be held on either a Wednesday or Thursday afternoon. To efficiently run one of the experiences we need 6 people per day.

I would suggest that the experience is a great team building event, shift outing, a retirement gift, promotion gift or even a moving department gift and a great way for retired officers to meet up in a fun and relaxed environment. For each participant on the dive experience another person gets free entry to the aquarium, so family and friends can come along and watch and take plenty of pictures and videos.

I respectfully request that you circulate this offer to your members and also to your police staff and NARPO colleagues.
