Certificate of Service Issues—Now resolved

A number of retired officers raised an issue about the Norfolk Constabulary and certificates of Service on retirement. There were a number of cases where the Certificate had the wrong dates on, or wrong rank and some who didn't receive one at all.

As a result of this being brought to NARPOs attention, a meeting was held with the Norfolk Police Federation to discuss the best way of achieving a fair and consistent approach for all. Samantha Hawkins, the General Secretary of the Norfolk Police Federation, agreed to take this issue to the Force Executive and a way forward has now been put in place to ensure in the future there will be a consistent approach. For those retired officers who have an issue, the Force are eagre to put this right. Please see below the update from Sam :

'The Force exec have confirmed that they now have a new system in place between the Staff Office and HR, whereby the Staff Office are copied into every ENACT leaver notification. This process ensures that the Exec are notified of all officers and staff who are due to retire. All retirees who have over 10 years of service are invited, together with a guest, to meet with the Chief and to be presented with their framed retirement certificate. Those with under 10 years' service and those who do not wish to meet the Chief, receive their certificate in a Constabulary presentation folder, with a personally signed letter from the Chief posted to their home address.

With regard to the retired officers who have previously had issues with or not received their certificates- the below message was posted onto the Norfolk Police past and present Facebook site yesterday, by me, and Chris Banks has already received numerous emails as a result.'

Norfolk Force Executive have been made aware that a small number of retired Officers did not receive certificates of service or mistakes were made on the certificates they did receive. This falls well below our usual standards and I apologise. I would like to write to you further and rectify. Please email me your details at Christopher.banks@norfolk.police.uk


Phoenix Television New Documentary Series
